Sultana - Greatest Naval Disaster



Van Young

Tuesday, October 8, Van Young will be sharing his thoughts about one of America's greatest naval tragedies when he addresses the Big Walnut Area Historical Society and guests in the Myers Inn Meeting Room beginning at 7:30.

Near the very end of the civil war, a river steamship called, Sultana, exploded on the Mississippi River as it was returning north with hundreds of just released Union Army prisoners of war.

Why do so few Americans know of this disaster? What caused this explosion? Who was held responsible? Many questions exist, even today.

So to tell us more about this sad piece of American history, Van Young is returning to the Myers Inn Museum.

Van was born and raised in Ohio and has been a resident of Columbus for the last 36 years. Since his retirement in 2012 from AT&T, one of his goals was to spend time studying and learning more about the Civil War,

Van is active in two other area civil war organizations and is president of The Worthington Griswold History group that meets on Monday mornings at 10:00 am, at the Griswold Center, in Worthington, Everyone is welcome to attend the meetings, which are free of charge.

3rd Graders Scheduling Field Trips

Each year the 3rd grade teachers from the four elementary schools schedule field trips to visit the Myers Inn and learn a little about history in this area. Most visits start with a powerpoint of the buildings around the Sunbury square and how these have impacted our history. This is done in the school in preparation for the field trip.

On the day of the field trip 6 docents present 10 minute presentations in the Myers Inn and barn on a variety of topics of local history. Technology is left behind so the students can react with the presenters. Guides are used to lead the children through the sessions. Thirteen volunteers are needed to serve as docents and guides.

Docents need to take a training and learn the stories that go with the different things in the room they will be working in. No one is left to their own devices until trained.

Guides do not need as much training and are used to guide people from place to place or sit in a room to provide security and answer questions. These positions are very rewarding and worth the time you put into them.

Community Library Visitor Solves Lawrence Myers' Mystery

On June 12, 1991, the library was in the Town Hall on Sunbury Square. My office as Assistant Director was on the second floor. I had gone to the first floor for a break and heard a girl's voice say, "Suppose this Eliza is our Elizabeth?" I only knew one Eliza - Eliza Myers the wife of Lawrence Myers, one of the co-founders of our town and the original owner of the Myers Inn.

Gail Myers introduced himself and explained they were on a Summer Break Field Trip to see if they could find the Sunbury where his ancestors lived and maybe their tombstones. He had copies of family names from a Bible and the little history he knew. He was aware there were 2 Sunburys still on the map (there had been 5 at one time) but we were the closest to Granville where they lived and his wife was President of Denison University. His children, Erika and David, and David's friend Eben Kenah were on this field trip with Gail. Imagine the thrill to learn on their first stop, they found the right town and that Gail's 4th great grandfather was its co-founder.

By this time I had spent months of spare time in the courthouse going through records trying to piece the history of the town together. I had visited Wilkes Barre, PA, and gone through their records. My biggest problem was Eliza's maiden name. Everything I found pointed to Bennett but a voice in the night insisted it was Brown. Gail told me Bennett but agreed to call his brother and have him send me copies of the family Bible which he had in Tulsa, OK. Her name was indeed Brown. She was the daughter of Major Brown in Berkshire Corners. Mystery solved.

Gail's brother Lawrence (each generation has had a Lawrence since our Lawrence's Uncle Lawrence who gave money to the boys from his American Revolution pension which they used to purchase the land that would be Sunbury) and his wife Edith agreed to come to Sunbury three weeks later for its 175th Celebration and to be honored in the parade on July 6th. They returned with their grandsons.

Both Gail and Lawrence made other trips to Sunbury. Gail continued to do research and shared it with me. I shared my findings with him. Lawrence and Edith moved from Tulsa to Sheboygan, Wisconsin. They are both deceased but their son Lawrence who lives in Colorado, has been a member of BWAHS.

Gail moved to Oregon to be near family and always stayed in touch with me. Until recently he had been a member of BWAHS. His cousin, George Lawson of Oregon, has continued the Myers research (his mother, Reatha Myers, was the gg granddaughter of our Lawrence Myers). George has a great website at <https://olelarsonsfolks.net>.

Just before the last newsletter was sent, George told me Gail Myers died August 11, 2019 at the age of 96.
