New People Take Office in 2020

Big Walnut Area Historical Society members at the November meeting elected officers for the following year. Bill Kavage continued as Treasurer and Porter "Chip" Welch became the Secretary. Both offices have 2 year terms and expire in December 2021.

Former Secretary, Damon Bower became a Trustee with Carol Wood whose term was renewed. President Bill Comisford appointed Brock Schmaltz to fill the term vacated by Chip Welch - all three will serve through December 2022.

Quin Thomas was appointed by Comisford to fill a vacant term which expires in December 2921 with Alice Lacher and Amy Welsh.

Long term trustees, Suzanne Allen was made Trustee Emeritus for her extended years of service to the organization.

Horn Inducted into Big Walnut Alumni Hall of Fame

On November 11, members of the Principal's Student Leadership Team honored Polly Horn at the annual induction ceremony they planned and carried out in the high school Innovation Center.

Since 2015, when the Hall of Fame was started to recognize the accomplishments of graduates of Big Walnut High school, members of the Leadership Team review nominations made by the public and select the member based on their career accomplishments and contributions to society.

Roger Roberts, former Big Walnut Career Guidance Counselor and History Teacher, nominated Horn for

the award. When the students voted, Horn received a unanimous vote. "It is a great honor to have students choose me for this award. It tells me the many things the Big Walnut Area Historical Society does for the schools is meaningful. I retired as director of Community Library in 2005 which is probably before their memories," notes Horn, who raised funds and designed Community Library which opened in 1994.

Horn is a charter member of the Sunbury/Big Walnut Chamber of Commerce, a co-chair of the first Christmas on the Square, and active in all community celebrations since she returned to Sunbury in 1971. She was a Girl Scout leader and founder of the Big Walnut Girl Scout Service Unit which supported 14 troops and their Day Camp at B.W. Conservation Club. She has served on boards for United Way, Art Castle, Chamber, Delaware County Convention and Visitor Board of Trustees, Sunbury Record Commission, Village Safety Commission, headed Marble Tree Fund to care for trees on Sunbury Square, and helped put General W.S. Rosecrans on Sunbury Square.

Horn is active in Condit Presbyterian Church where she serves as Clerk of Session, is a second term Elder, sings in the choir, is webmaster and editor of the church newsletter. She is the mother of 3 adult children, has 14 grandchildren, and a great grandson.

"Most of the things I am known for are things I've done as a volunteer. My father instructed us to leave the world better than it was when we were born. That has been my guiding motto. I did not do any of them for recognition, I did them because doing them would help improve the life in the community. Not everything we worked on succeeded, such as the Green Belt Plan for the Village. Although it failed, Community Library was built as the head of the proposed plan and with The Fallen Heroes Memorial, the area has become an extended focal point of the village square," noted Horn when she received the Delaware County Foundation's Outstanding Volunteer Award.
